

New Zealand ShakeOut 2019

We are holding an earthquake emergency drill on Wednesday 23rd October at 11.45 am as part of the New Zealand ShakeOut 2019.

How to ShakeOut

New Zealand ShakeOut is a self-run earthquake drill.

- **DROP** down on your hands and knees. This protects you from falling but lets you move if you need to.
- **COVER** your head and neck (or your entire body if possible) under a sturdy table or desk (if it is within a few steps of you).
- **HOLD** on to your shelter (or your position to protect your head and neck) until the shaking stops. If the shaking shifts your shelter around, move with it.

Car speeds on surrounding roads and parking matters

Speeding

It has come to our attention that drivers are not adhering to the legal speed limit close to the school, especially on Sheehan Ave and Maurice St. Please make sure you are careful around the school especially around start and finish times. The speed limit around schools from 8 am to 3.30 pm is 40 km, drivers are exceeding this speed by far more. Maurice Street

We have also been told of parents/caregivers using the back entrance of the school (Maurice St) as a turning point. This not only causes congestion but it is extremely unsafe, this where children exit the school grounds and also walk around the footpath, it is only a matter of time before a child is accidently hurt. Please do not drive the whole way down Maurice St, park further up the road, children are more than capable of walking the few extra metres.

Kelvin Road

It is becoming more and more frequent that parents/caregivers are using the school driveway entrance as a drop off point. This is not only blocking the gate from staff to enter but it also means you are parked over a pedestrian crossing that links the footpath across the driveway. By staff having to wait on the road it means they are also holding up the traffic on Kelvin Road. Please refrain from doing this and let others know to do the same.

We would hate to involve the Police or Auckland transport in these matters as it may result in parking infringement tickets.

Rubbish

Please be mindful of our surrounding neighbours and keep our neighbourhood clean. Can you please talk with your tamariki about make sure they do not drop rubbish on their way home from school and to make sure they place it in a rubbish bin.

We have also had complaints from houses close by regarding parents/caregivers leaving rubbish on the side of the road and in the gutters after they have picked up their children. Please be a tidy kiwi and take your rubbish with you.
