Ministry Update - Returning to school following illness						
Wed 14th Dec End of Term 4	The Ministry of Health has confirmed that the guidance for returning to schools following vomiting or diarrhoea has not changed. If a child is free of those symptoms for 48 hours, they can attend school again. We have updated the winter wellness guidance for parents, caregivers and whānau to reflect the following points:					
<u>BOT meetings</u> <u>2022</u>	• If a child has been unwell with a respiratory illness other than COVID-19, they can return to school 24 hours after they have significantly improved and are behaving/eating					
20 September 18 October 15 November	<ul> <li>normally.</li> <li>Following vomiting or diarrhoea, a child should be symptom free for 48 hours before they can return.</li> <li>If they still have a runny nose or dry cough without any other symptoms such as a fever, vomiting or diarrhoea, then they are unlikely to be infectious and can be considered well enough to attend school.</li> </ul>

### Summary from Community Consultation of the School Charter - 22 June 2022

We held three-way conferences on 22 June 2022. During that time we consulted with our parents with the following questions.

- 1. Is there anything that you think should always be included in Kelvin Road School Charter Strategic Plan?
- 2. What has been helpful for your child learning at Kelvin Road School?
- 3. What do you think we could do better with regards to supporting the teaching and learning of your child?

#### Parent/caregiver responses align with the Strategic Goals of The Charter.

#### 1. Learners At The Centre

#### Learners with their whānau are at the centre of education

Parents indicated the importance of; life and social skills, personal safety, acceptance of other cultures, cultural identity and a balanced curriculum; e.g Keep Ourselves Safe - Covid, digital safety, biking and scootering to school (travelling and road safety) well-being were mentioned examples of what parents want for their children. A common theme was that parents felt welcomed and included at Kelvin Road School. One parent commented that 'I love KRS already'. While another parent responded to what we could do better by making the comment 'I think you do heaps here, KRS is better (a whole lot better) from learning to (addressing) bullying'. 'My kids have been to many schools in Papakura and this one is the best.'

#### 2. Barrier-Free Access

#### Great education opportunities and outcomes are within reach for every learner

We will accelerate student achievement in reading, writing and mathematics through the development of teacher pedagogy.

Parents wanted quality teaching predominantly in Reading and Maths skills for their tamariki.

Parents mentioned homework as some way of supporting their child. Each parent who asked this question was encouraged to talk to their child's teacher and each teacher was directed to follow through with support.

#### 3. Quality Teaching

#### Quality teaching and leadership make a difference for learners and their whānau.

Parents and caregivers were overwhelmingly supportive of the quality of teaching that their child receives. One parent positively commented that Kelvin Road School had 'Proper teachers that do so much' for their child. Teacher Aides were positively mentioned as strong support for their child's learning.

A question was asked of staffing by one parent. Teacher staffing is an issue that our school continues to work hard to address and to ensure that as a school we are open to onsite learning every day for our community, despite staff shortages and absenteeism due to staff sickness.

#### 4. Future of Learning and Work

Learning that is relevant to the lives of New Zealanders today and throughout their lives. We will develop effective relationships with our whānau and community to support students along their educational pathway.

Complementary comments were made about our teachers' commitment and connection to their child's development. Teachers and parents realise that email, texting and phone calls to keep the lines of communication open were essential especially given the impact of Covid on being able to not always make face-to-face hui. Facebook, Class Dojo and Skool Loop were cited as another good form of communication by parents.
