What we know about attendance and lateness at Kelvin Road School:

We found that what you do can have a big impact on your child's attendance and lateness. Parents who are comfortable with their child missing a week or more of school per term are more than twice as likely to have a child who doesn't regularly attend school. It is never too early to start. When children miss some school early on, it can lead to missing more later on too.

If your child is regularly late for school they miss out on the first instructions for the day. This can be destabilising for them and the class.

When your child is at primary school, your input is even more important. You can help set up good habits that will last for the whole time they are at school.

- Regular attendance at school helps build and maintain a child's learning and positive daily habits and routines, as well as promoting your child's well-being by connecting them to their peers and learning new things.
- We want our akonga to thrive and be resilient and active members within their whanau and community.
- Attendance matters and we can all work together to increase school attendance. Please communicate and explain if your child is absent from school and the reason why.

If your child misses 20 days of school every year, by the end of Year 12 they will have missed more than a year of schooling.

We want to increase attendance and promptness for every child in our school to help them learn and develop good habits and lifelong skills.
